- WRC aims to adopt cost effective practices that eliminate or minimise negative environmental impacts.
- WRC aims to manage programmes and projects in a way that prevents pollution and is protective of the environment.
- WRC committed to developing the use of renewable energy, grey water recycling and sustainable drainage within the building management.

Club members are encouraged to adhere to the following best practice;

- comply with Health and Safety regulations
- comply with insurance stipulations
- encourage members not to waste water
- use eco-friendly cleaning materials when available
- ensure that items of litter are disposed of properly
- carry out periodic litter picks of surrounding area and River Mersey
- minimise the use of paper by using email as the main line of club communication
- mend equipment where appropriate rather than purchase new equipment
- recycle waste materials – particularly plastic bottles from sports drinks
- turn lights off when not in use
- do not leave electrical equipment including heaters on between session times
- encouraging car sharing to events such as regattas
